1. **Review Minutes:** The Council reviewed last months meeting minutes. There are no adjustments to be made.
2. **Presentation:** Presentation: Results of the Winnepesaukee Region Partner Tool Survey - Lea Ayers LaFave from the Community Health Institute. Power Point presentation will be distributed to Council when received.
 - PARTNER tool survey 2016 had a response rate of 89%, high response rate compared to other regions in the state.
 - Network scores for the Winnepesaukee Region were much higher with the exception of centralization, which is slightly below average.
 - The toolkit measures 3 levels of partnership: cooperative, coordinated and integrated.
 - Questions that were asked of agencies were related to the Community Health Improvement Plans priorities.
 - Lisa Morris (PPH) asked the Council how the information collected can be used to strengthen agency connections to one another. Susan Wnuk (CAP) and Marge Kerns (LRGHealthcare) both felt that having conversations with the organizations to brainstorm how they feel about the survey results. Susan also felt it's a good opportunity to meet with the less connected agencies. David Emberley (Central VNA & Hospice) felt that they could use this as a score card. Lisa Morris (PPH) asked to see a comparison of 2014 vs 2016 results. She wants to see how the relationships are creating change, growth or lack of growth. Asking community agencies if results were expected is important as well.
3. **Target Groups-** Identification of Community Outreach
 - Paul Branscombe (Town of Gilmanton) is gathering a group of individuals in the Town of Gilmanton. It is important for the town workers to understand the demographics of the town. Lisa Morris (PPH) suggested that we bring " Bridges Out of Poverty" speaker (Prudence Pease) back. Pru made an impact on the region a few years ago telling her own story about living in poverty.
 - Paul Branscombe (Town of Gilmanton), David Emberley (Central VNA & Hospice), Kathy Randazzo (Genesis Behavioral Health) volunteered to work together to explore opportunities to make presentations to towns regarding the social determinates of health.
