Agenda:

1. Welcome and Communications:

- Lisa Morris (PPH) handed out the meeting agenda, an example of an infographic and a draft copy of the Presenters Guide for the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP).

2. WPHC Website Update: winniphc.org, Member Listing:

- Website: Winniphc.org domain has been purchased. Site is currently inactive but will be updated next month. It will be accessed through pphnh.org as a separate tab or direct through the winniphc.org website. A member listing will be located on the website.

3. CHIP Facilitators Guide:

- Lisa Morris (PPH) discussed attached copy of the draft for CHIP facilitators guide that may be used as a guideline for presentations. It was discussed among the Council, that visuals would be helpful for presentations such as posters and PowerPoint's. Scoop Welch (GUV) thought it would be helpful to have presentations targeted to different audiences. Jeff Hayes (LRPC) thought group discussions would be a way of getting the target audience engaged. Rick Silverberg (Health First Family Care Center) thought that contact cards would be an effective way to give information out to people who are interested in learning more about a specific work group. Jenn Sumner (Project Aware, Franklin) suggested that the Council members list who their target audiences are. Outcome: Lisa Morris will work on development of infographics and other presenter tools.

4. Presentations:

a) Continuation: Part II Reduce Substance Misuse Work Group and Naloxone Update-Lisa Leary, Director Substance Abuse Systems Integration:

- Goal 4- Increase local capacity across 15 towns. Strategy-Gap assessment. Implementation of plan to address gaps such as financial stability, resilience, and wellness.
- Goal 5-Complete gap assessment of services. Strategy-To be completed by May of 2016.
- Goal 6-Develop a plan to identify gaps in service. Strategy-To be completed by August of 2016.
- Naloxone Update-Education and training will be held January 11th, 2016 from 11am-12:30 PM at the Beane Conference Center in Laconia. It will be advertised via social media, newspaper, and radio. Naloxone kits will be handed out. The bag will contain the kit and a one pager with resource information.

b) Reducing Motor Vehicle Accidents Amongst Adolescence and their Passengers-Scott Hess, Belmont High School: Scott Hess presented on Student Against Deadly Decisions (SADD) Program which promotes basic safety and well being of students. SADD works by empowering students by creating activities to get students involved by school announcements, posters, pledge boards. Word of mouth increased memberships from 5 to 10 students. Approximately 70 students pledged not to text and drive. Students will be involved in a recording a video of a mock crash. Information that is filmed is displayed as "advertisement" before guest speakers and lecturers at the school.
